## **The Importance of God's Word: Part 2 (Scriptures)**

**2 Timothy 3:16 NASB** All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness;

**Matthew 7:24-27 NASB** "Therefore everyone who hears these words of Mine and acts on them, may be compared to a wise man who built his house on the rock. (25) "And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and slammed against that house; and yet it did not fall, for it had been founded on the rock. (26) "Everyone who hears these words of Mine and does not act on them, will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. (27) "The rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and slammed against that house; and it fell--and great was its fall."

**Colossians 2:8 NASB** See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deception, according to the tradition of men, according to the elementary principles of the world, rather than according to Christ.

**John 1:1-14 NASB** In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ... (14) And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.

**Joshua 1:8 NASB** "This book of the law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it; for then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have success.

**Matthew 4:4 NASB** But He answered and said, "It is written, 'MAN SHALL NOT LIVE ON BREAD ALONE, BUT ON EVERY WORD THAT PROCEEDS OUT OF THE MOUTH OF GOD.'"

**Deuteronomy 8:1-3 NASB** "All the commandments that I am commanding you today you shall be careful to do, that you may live and multiply, and go in and possess the land which the LORD swore *to give* to your forefathers. (2) "You shall remember all the way which the LORD your God has led you in the wilderness these forty years, that He might humble you, testing you, to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep His commandments or not. (3) "He humbled you and let you be hungry, and fed you with manna which you did not know, nor did your fathers know, that He might make you understand that man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by everything that proceeds out of the mouth of the LORD.

**Job 23:12 NASB** "I have not departed from the command of His lips; I have treasured the words of His mouth more than my necessary food.

**John 6:63 NASB** "It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing; the words that I have spoken to you are spirit and are life.

**Hebrews 4:12 NASB** For the word of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

**Revelation 19:13 NASB** *He is* clothed with a robe dipped in blood, and His name is called The Word of God.

**James 1:22-25 NASB** But prove yourselves doers of the word, and not merely hearers who delude themselves. (23) For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks at his natural face in a mirror; (24) for *once* he has looked at himself and gone away, he has immediately forgotten what kind of person he was. (25) But one who looks intently at the perfect law, the *law* of liberty, and abides by it, not having become a forgetful hearer but an effectual doer, this man will be blessed in what he does.

**John 14:21 NASB** "He who has My commandments and keeps them is the one who loves Me; and he who loves Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love him and will disclose Myself to him."

**Ecclesiastes 12:13-14 NASB (13)** The conclusion, when all has been heard, *is*: fear God and keep His commandments, because this *applies to* every person. **(14)** For God will bring every act to judgment, everything which is hidden, whether it is good or evil.

**Luke 10:38-42 NASB** Now as they were traveling along, He entered a village; and a woman named Martha welcomed Him into her home. **(39)** She had a sister called Mary, who was seated at the Lord's feet, listening to His word. **(40)** But Martha was distracted with all her preparations; and she came up *to Him* and said, "Lord, do You not care that my sister has left me to do all the serving alone? Then tell her to help me." **(41)** But the Lord answered and said to her, "**Martha, Martha, you are worried and bothered about so many things; (42) but only one thing is necessary, for Mary has chosen the good part, which shall not be taken away from her.**"
