Having A Servant's Heart (Scriptures)

2 Timothy 3:1-5 NASB But realize this, that in the last days difficult times will come. (2) For men will be lovers of self, lovers of money, boastful, arrogant, revilers, disobedient to parents, ungrateful, unholy, (3) unloving, irreconcilable, malicious gossips, without self-control, brutal, haters of good, (4) treacherous, reckless, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, (5) holding to a form of godliness, although they have denied its power; Avoid such men as these.

Luke 9:23 NASB And He was saying to *them* all, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross daily and follow Me.

Philippians 2:3-4 NASB Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; (4) do not *merely* look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others.

1 Corinthians 10:23-24 NASB (23) All things are lawful, but not all things are profitable. All things are lawful, but not all things edify. (24) Let no one seek his own *good*, but that of his neighbor.

Galatians 5:13 NASB For you were called to freedom, brethren; only *do not turn* your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another.

1 Peter 4:10 NASB As each one has received a *special* gift, employ it in serving one another as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.

Mark 10:45 NASB "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many."

Matthew 20:28 NASB just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many."

Philippians 2:5-8 NASB Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, (6) who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, (7) but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, *and* being made in the likeness of men. (8) Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

John 4:31-34 NASB Meanwhile the disciples were urging Him, saying, "Rabbi, eat." (32) But He said to them, "I have food to eat that you do not know about." (33) So the disciples were saying to one another, "No one brought Him *anything* to eat, did he?" (34) Jesus *said to them, "My food is to do the will of Him who sent Me and to accomplish His work.

Luke 22:41-44 NASB And He withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and He knelt down and *began* to pray, (42) saying, "Father, if You are willing, remove this cup from Me; yet not My will, but Yours be done." (43) Now an angel from heaven appeared to Him, strengthening Him. (44) And being in agony He was praying very fervently; and His sweat became like drops of blood, falling down upon the ground.

John 5:19 NASB Therefore Jesus answered and was saying to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of Himself, unless *it is* something He sees the Father doing; for whatever the Father does, these things the Son also does in like manner.

John 13:1-16 NASB Now before the Feast of the Passover, Jesus knowing that His hour had come that He would depart out of this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end. (2) During supper, the devil having already put into the heart of Judas Iscariot, *the son* of Simon, to betray Him, (3) *Jesus*, knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that He had come forth from God and was going back to God, (4) *got up from supper, and *laid aside His garments; and taking a towel, He girded Himself. (5) Then He *poured water into the basin, and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel with which He was girded. (6) So He *came to Simon

Peter. He *said to Him, "Lord, do You wash my feet?" (7) Jesus answered and said to him, "What I do you do not realize now, but you will understand hereafter." (8) Peter *said to Him, "Never shall You wash my feet!" Jesus answered him, "If I do not wash you, you have no part with Me." (9) Simon Peter *said to Him, "Lord, *then wash* not only my feet, but also my hands and my head." (10) Jesus *said to him, "He who has bathed needs only to wash his feet, but is completely clean; and you are clean, but not all of you." (11) For He knew the one who was betraying Him; for this reason He said, "Not all of you are clean." (12) So when He had washed their feet, and taken His garments and reclined *at the table* again, He said to them, "Do you know what I have done to you? (13) "You call Me Teacher and Lord; and you are right, for so I am. (14) "If I then, the Lord and the Teacher, washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. (15) "For I gave you an example that you also should do as I did to you. (16) "Truly, truly, I say to you, a slave is not greater than his master, nor *is* one who is sent greater than the one who sent him.

Deuteronomy 15:12-17 NASB (12) "If your kinsman, a Hebrew man or woman, is sold to you, then he shall serve you six years, but in the seventh year you shall set him free. (13) "When you set him free, you shall not send him away empty-handed. (14) "You shall furnish him liberally from your flock and from your threshing floor and from your wine vat; you shall give to him as the LORD your God has blessed you. (15) "You shall remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the LORD your God redeemed you; therefore I command you this today. (16) "It shall come about if he says to you, 'I will not go out from you,' because he loves you and your household, since he fares well with you; (17) then you shall take an awl and pierce it through his ear into the door, and he shall be your servant forever. Also you shall do likewise to your maidservant.

Romans 1:1 NASB Paul, a bond-servant of Christ Jesus, called *as* an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God,

James 1:1 NASB James, a bond-servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, To the twelve tribes who are dispersed abroad: Greetings.

2 Peter 1:1 NASB Simon Peter, a bond-servant and apostle of Jesus Christ, To those who have received a faith of the same kind as ours, by the righteousness of our God and Savior, Jesus Christ:

Jude 1:1 NASB Jude, a bond-servant of Jesus Christ, and brother of James, To those who are the called, beloved in God the Father, and kept for Jesus Christ:

Revelation 1:1 NASB The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show to His bond-servants, the things which must soon take place; and He sent and communicated *it* by His angel to His bond-servant John,

2 Corinthians 4:5 NASB For we do not preach ourselves but Christ Jesus as Lord, and ourselves as your bond-servants for Jesus' sake.

2 Corinthians 12:15 NASB (15) I will most gladly spend and be expended for your souls. If I love you more, am I to be loved less?

1 Corinthians 3:1-5 NASB (1) And I, brethren, could not speak to you as to spiritual men, but as to men of flesh, as to infants in Christ. **(2)** I gave you milk to drink, not solid food; for you were not yet able *to receive it*. Indeed, even now you are not yet able, **(3)** for you are still fleshly. For since there is jealousy and strife among you, are you not fleshly, and are you not walking like mere men? **(4)** For when one says, "I am of Paul," and another, "I am of Apollos," are you not *mere* men? **(5)** What then is Apollos? And what is Paul? Servants through whom you believed, even as the Lord gave *opportunity* to each one.

James 4:1-4 NASB What is the source of quarrels and conflicts among you? Is not the source your pleasures that wage war in your members? **(2)** You lust and do not have; *so* you commit murder. You are envious and cannot obtain; *so* you fight and quarrel. You do not have because you do not ask. **(3)** You ask and do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, so that you may spend *it* on your pleasures. **(4)** You adulteresses, do you not know that friendship with the world is hostility toward God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God.

Luke 17:7-10 NASB "Which of you, having a slave plowing or tending sheep, will say to him when he has come in from the field, 'Come immediately and sit down to eat'? **(8)** "But will he not say to him, 'Prepare something for me to eat, and *properly* clothe yourself and serve me while I eat and drink; and afterward you may eat and drink'? **(9)** "He does not thank the slave because he did the things which were commanded, does he? **(10)** "So you too, when you do all the things

which are commanded you, say, 'We are unworthy slaves; we have done *only* that which we ought to have done.'

John 15:4-5 NASB "Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself unless it abides in the vine, so neither *can* you unless you abide in Me. (5) "I am the vine, you are the branches; he who abides in Me and I in him, he bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing.
